WEBSITE PRIVACY POLICY



This Privacy Policy describes the ways in which the Code Administrator Association of Kentucky ("we," "our," or "us") collects, uses, and discloses information about you, through www.caak.org, and our related platforms. - To choose not to be included in any transfer of data to any third party for any use unrelated to the stated purpose for which the data was collected.

Information We Collect About You

Information You Provide. We and our service providers collect any information that you provide when you use the Online Platforms, including when you create an account or contact us with questions or comments.

The information that you provide us can include, but is not limited to:

- Information provided by you when accessing services through the Online Platforms, such as your name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, username, password, and other registration information.
- Credit or debit card, bank account, or other transaction-related information collected from you when requesting a service (such as an online payment).
- Information you provide us through customer service correspondence and general feedback.

Information Automatically Collected From You. We and our service providers may automatically collect certain technical information from your computer or mobile device over time and across different websites when you use the Online Platforms, such as your Internet Protocol address, your general geographic location, your browser type, your operating system, the pages you view on the Online Platforms, the pages you view immediately before and after you access the Online Platforms, and the search terms you enter on the Online Platforms. This information allows us to recognize you and personalize your experience if you return to the Online Platforms, and to improve the Online Platforms and the services we provide. We and our service providers may collect this information using "cookies," which are small text files that the Online Platforms save on your computer using your web browser and access when you return, or similar technologies.

How We Use Information We Collect

We may use the information we collect for a number of purposes, including but not limited to:

- providing you with services or information you request;
- contacting you about the services you order or important changes to the Online Services. Because this information may be important to your use of the Online Services, the fulfillment of your request, or required by Federal regulation, you may not opt-out of receiving such communications;
- allowing us to improve the Online Services and the services we provide;
- generating and analyzing statistics about your use of the Online Platforms;

How We Disclose Your Information:

We take appropriate security measures to protect against unauthorized access to data. These measures include internal and external reviews of our data collection, storage, and processing practices and security measures, including physical security measures to guard against unauthorized access to systems where we store personal data.

We may disclose the information we collect from you through the Online Platforms:

- to third parties that provide services to us in connection with fulfilling your requests, including, but not limited to, third parties that provide payment processing services, third parties that help us maintain an accounting of contributions, and your payroll office;
- as required by law, such as to comply with a subpoena or other legal process, or to comply with government reporting obligations;
- when we believe in good faith that disclosure is necessary (a) to protect our rights, the integrity of the Online Platforms, or your safety or the safety of others, or (b) to detect, prevent, or respond to fraud, intellectual property infringement, violations of law, or other misuse of the Online Platforms; and
